How to participate in the Backpack Auction...

1. Review the auction items in this catalog. Items are divided into sections: Camps, Community, Claypit Hill, Happy Hollow, and Loker. ***Catalog pages are double-sided.***
2. Choose the item(s) on which you would like to bid.
3. Write your best and final bid(s) along with your contact information on the Bid Form on this catalog's last page.
4. Sign and return your form by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 2, to your child's school's Backpack Auction Drop-Box or email your bid(s) to BackpackAuction@gmail.com.

Auction FAQs...

Is there a minimum bid?

Teacher items have a minimum bid of \$25.00.

How can I pay for the items I win?

We are able to accept payment by checks only.

When are bids due?

BIDS ARE DUE BY 5:00 P.M. ON THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 2.

How will I find out if I won?

Winners will be notified via e-mail...that's why we need your e-mail address, and we need to be able to read it, too! You will NOT be notified if you do not win.

When will I find out if I won?

Winners will be notified via e-mail by Friday, February 10.

When is payment due for items I've won?

Checks are due February 17. Please drop your check in the PTO mailbox at your child's school. If we do not receive a check by February 17, we will send a reminder. If, after the reminder, we do not receive a check by March 1, the Auction Committee reserves the right to award the item to the next highest bidder.

How will ties be handled?

If there is a tie on an item, each family will be contacted via e-mail by February 10 and asked to increase its bid. If we do not hear back from you within 48 hours you will be taken out of the running. The highest re-bid will win.

How do I find out more about the camps before I bid?

Please use the internet to research any camps in more detail.

How do I get camp information if I won?

Once we receive your payment, winners of camp bids will receive a detailed packet from the Auction Committee.
